The Museum is in the Mayflower Council, BSA and operated by the Camp Squanto Alumni Association. The Casoni Museum is a member of the American Alliance of Museums, Washington, DC.

**Hours of Operation:** During the summer camp season, seven days a week while summer camp is in session. Year round they are open weekends (Friday & Saturday) or by appointment.

**Admission fee:** Free, but donations are always gratefully accepted.

**Brochure:** A brochure is available and is provided to unit leaders who attend summer camp to encourage their units to take advantage of what the museum has to offer.

**Patches:** The Alumni Association issues new patches every year, and a newsletter is available at the museum.

**Gift Shop:** There is a well-stocked sales counter with a wide variety of patches and other items. They also had a table with items that could be had for a donation. 100% of all money raised is used to support Camp Squanto.

Peter Glass shared that they have almost 3,000 visitors each year, and I believe that this is probably the highest number of visitors that I know of, other than the National Scouting Museum. They did not have an exact number on the size of their collection, but there are several thousand items being preserved in the museum.

**History:** The museum was founded by and is named for Almero "Skiddie" Casoni, who helped develop Camp Squanto in 1949. The museum was housed in a small building at camp, and in 2010 they were able to move into a new building with the cost being split between the Alumni Association and the council. Camp Squanto was first started in 1925 at Bloody Pond, in 1950 the camp was moved to its present location on Fawn Pond. Camp Squanto was named to honor Squanto of the Pawtuxet Tribe. He served as a liaison between the Native Americans and the settlers, he aided the Pilgrims in Plymouth helping them



to survive the first few difficult years of the settlement. Camp Squanto is less than 30 minutes from Plymouth Rock, Mayflower and Plimoth Plantation, so many troops stay at camp to visit the historic sites.

**Museum Mission:** “The mission of the Casoni Museum is to preserve the scouting heritage of the Old Colony and Mayflower councils while inspiring youth about scouting traditions and values through an interactive educational structure. The museum will collect, preserve and display scouting artifacts and publications; conduct research, provide educational materials and events and educate, enrich and inspire youth and the general public with the ideals represented by the scouting movement.”

**Museum Focus:** History of the Old Colony Council, its lodges (Manomet, Tisquantum) and the successor Mayflower Council and Tantamous Lodge.

**Personnel:** There is one paid camp staff member during the summer camp season who supervises younger staff. The Camp Squanto Alumni Association is the key support for the museum. Camp Squanto has about 50 campmasters that are trained to open the museum and the Trading Post every weekend. Peter said that they have a museum work day every Tuesday.

#### Interesting Facts

- Camp Squanto is located in cranberry country, and was moved to land donated in 1950 by LeBarron R. Baker, a local cranberry grower. Camp Squanto is part of the LeBarron R. Baker Scout Reservation which is located deep in the woods of the Myles Standish State Forest.
- The museum is decorated every year for Christmas.
- The museum has done an excellent job of using all available space – they even had displays in the rest room!
- All new scouts at summer camp visit the museum as part of the Flight to Eagle program.
- The Council is running a “Building Character for Our Future” program to raise funds for capital development at the camp. There is an “Honor Plaza” program for donors to buy paver bricks to be placed in front of the Casoni Museum. There is also a shadow box program for units to sponsor, that will be hung on the walls of the dining hall at Camp Squanto.



#### Special Features:

- The museum is heated and air conditioned, and has become the place to hang out during camp.
- The museum houses council records dating back to the 1920's.
- Many troops who come to Plymouth to see the Mayflower and other historical sites also visit the museum.
- The museum is “hands on” so that visitors can touch many of the items on display.
- The museum is fully integrated into the summer camp program.
- A “Self-Guided Tour Book” is available for visitors to use to explore the museum.
- Many museum displays are frequently changed and rotated.

#### Museum Displays:

- Kudo Horn that came from Lady Baden-Powell is on display.
- Ribbons presented to the council from President Grover Cleveland in 1932, and President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1933.
- Scrapbook from the 1929 World Jamboree.
- Cartoons drawn for the OA Lodge by cartoonist Jeff Kinney, author of the *Diary of a Wimpy Kid* book series.
- Notebooks full of historic pictures.
- Special collection of patches from a troop that visited from Plymouth, England. They were working on the “Peregrine

Challenge" a program set up by the Plymouth Scout District in England to teach scouts about the Pilgrims and the Mayflower. Peregrine White was the first baby born on the Mayflower when it arrived in Plymouth (Mass.).

- Extensive display of BSA model trains. They are set up in a nice layout and can be run by museum visitors.




- Excellent Camp Squanto collection is on display.
- A portrait of Squanto was commissioned by the family of longtime Scouter Bob Whittier in honor of Bob's 90th birthday which now hangs in the Camp Squanto dining hall.
- Large Scout "nutcrackers" make for an attractive display
- Bronze casting of Baden-Powell's footprint.



- Many drawers of hat pins, neckerchief slides, bolos and more.
- Steve Scout display, many of the items have their original boxes.
- Large neckerchief slide collection.
- Excellent display of BSA items (games, craft kits, Signaler kits, personal camping items etc.) from the past. Many of the items are displayed with their original boxes.
- Order of the Arrow Lodge collection from Tantamous #233 and predecessor lodges (Tisquantum #164 and Manomet #164).

- Picture of Lady Baden-Powell from her visit to the council in 1966.



- The Alumni Association has twelve portable display panels featuring council and camp history. They are used in the museum or taken offsite to display as needed.
- Wooden Boy Scout wagon – circa 1920's,



#### Best Items in the collection:

- Kudo Horn that came from Lady Baden-Powell is on display.
- Camp Squanto collection.
- Manomet # 164 collection.

**Challenges:** Additional space is needed. A new addition to the building is being discussed for the future that would allow for more display area as well as a library and teaching area.



readers who may not have committed all of my columns to memory, I was writing about CAMP HAMILTON from Southeast Missouri (SEMO) Council. In the article, I showed a red felt shield-shaped patch with "Cape Girardeau" hand-written on the back of the patch. It was not my handwriting as it was legible.



I also showed a number of other Camp Hamilton patches from Hills and White Hills Council (not BSA Councils). However, I concluded that my red felt shield-shaped patch was from SEMO and was their Segregated Scout Camp (SSC) because Cape Girardeau is in Missouri.

I took a fair amount of "heat" following that column from local camp experts who felt strongly that the SEMO Camp Hamilton never issued a patch. We went back and forth and agreed to disagree on the ID of this patch.

Moving along from 2007 to 2023, Jeffrey Beach posted on the Scout Patch Collectors Facebook page that he had met a lady who's father was a Scout Executive many years ago with SEMO in the late 1940's. In his collection, he had two patches with the word "Negro" written next to them. One was my red felt shield and the other was a generic "Hik-O-Ree" patch. In case the writing on the note is not legible, it reads "Camp Hamilton (Negro) director/Hik-O-Ree (Negro)/Served as Postmaster/National Jamboree 1950/Valley Forge, Pa"

## Collecting Camp Patches

# VINDICATION

I will begin this column with a historical reference to a previous column of mine (June, 2007). For those

Tracy Mesler, who has a Facebook page for Segregated Scouting, sent a copy of an article dated 7/25/1947 from the Missouri Herald. In the *Along the Scouting Trail* column, the following was published: *Camp Hamilton for Negro Boy*. "A new Scout camp for Negro boys is under construction on the Black River, 16 miles north of Poplar Bluff, MO. Part of the funds necessary to build the camp named Camp Hamilton, were raised by the Lincoln Division Scouters and their friends. On July 25, Dr. Stanley Harris, national director of inter-racial Scouting will visit the camp site and help in the official dedication ceremonies. The


where members of the US Marine Reserves helped with a variety of civil engineering projects such as pouring a concrete foundation for the archery range, building new camp structures, widening roads and installing lights for the parking lot. In addition to the Scouts, Camp Baker hosts an autism camp, church and community groups.

When people in the area heard the Marines would be eating MRE's, a variety of foods were brought in by various groups and individuals, so the Marines had good wholesome food to eat while they worked on the Camp. Projects like this help train the Marines for both combat and humanitarian missions.

Russell Bennett informed me that Buckskin Council sold **CAMP CHIEF LOGAN** in the Spring of 2023 and **CAMP ROLAND** in the Fall of 2023.




Buckskin Council still maintains **CAMP ARROWHEAD**, **CAMP CHEROKEE** and **CAMP KOOTAGA**.



Trail Council. The BSA partnered with the Department of Defense via the Innovative Readiness Training Program

Here is a follow-up to a previous story about the fate of **BUCK HILL SCOUT RESERVATION CUB WORLD** in Burville, RI. You may recall my writing about a "Glamping" company that wanted to buy the land and construct many small cabins for family camping. That deal fell through, but Dick Cordes told me about



a deal that was made with the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management. The RI DEM will purchase 930 acres of the property and add it to the 6000 acres they currently maintain as open space. Narragansett Council will retain around 550 acres to be used for camping (half of this property is in Connecticut). Cub World stopped operating as a Summer camp several years ago.


Shaun Woolmer informed me about a previously unknown Scout camp. Shaun has an old Scout Songbook and one of the ditties was entitled "Take Me To CAMP PATAPS'CO". Shaun said it was located on the Potomac River and would have been owned by Baltimore Area Council.

**CAMP BLANTON**, formerly owned by Upper Cumberland, Cumberland, and later Blue Grass Councils in KY was sold in 1988. The 13-acre camp was opened in 1933 and was built as part of a Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) program.



Grover and Oxie Blanton donated the property to the Boy Scouts of Harlan County who maintained it for 50 years. The Camp Blanton Trust was formed in the mid-1980's and has operated the camp ever since. The property is open to everyone and has been used for weddings, reunions as well as camping. The Trust has started a fundraising project to build another cabin and help offset the \$50,000 that it costs to annually maintain the property.

Dick Cordes, the most-active contributor to this column, found an article about **CAMP NOCHAWAY**, run by Nocaway Council (#100 – Albany, GA) and it showed a 1920's earned patch. Dick found in the appendix of "The History of Chehaw

Council" an image of a patch from **CAMP SHEHAW** (aka **CAMP LITTLE CHEHAW**) as well as a mention of **CAMP THRONATEESEKA** that was represented by a map and photos.

Dick Cordes (who else???) sent a camp story with a happy ending. Donations, many sent along with heartwarming stories about protecting the land, helped the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation move forward with an agreement to buy the **LITTLE SIOUX SCOUT RANCH** in Western Iowa from the Mid-America Council. The non-profit conservation group raised nearly \$2 million to purchase the 1776-acre property that had been used as a Scout camp for more than 50 years by troops from IA, NE and SD. Scouts will continue to use the site along with other groups.

This is hot off the press – Dick sent this while I was writing this column.

Greater Los Angeles Area Council is working hard to keep **CAMP CHERRY VALLEY** operating after having celebrated their 100th anniversary.

Nothing is confirmed but they are taking deposits from Troops who wish to camp there in 2024. If the camp does not operate, Units may



request a refund or apply their payments towards a stay at **CAMP BIG HORN**. The GLAAC Scout Executive asked everyone to keep their fingers crossed and the

good thoughts flowing our way. I guess contributions to the Friends of Scouting aren't needed!!!

What's happening at the **CLAYTOR LAKE AQUATICS BASE**? I'm glad you asked. For nearly two decades, the CLAB has provided the BSA with easy access to many aquatic activities with an opportunity to earn merit badges relating to nautical activities. The CLAB, along with **CAMP POWHATAN** and **CAMP OTTARI** are all located in the heavily rural



Snowville/Hiwassee side of Claytor Lake. All three properties are owned by Blue Ridge Mountain Council. CLAB remains vacant for most of the year except for 5 weeks in the Summer. It is for sale although to date, any sale of the property has yet to be finalized.

Rob Kutz sent a scan of a 1921 booklet announcing that the Three Pond Camp Association is reopening their **THREE POND MOUNTAIN CAMP** in North Woodstock, NH. It sounds like a very rugged challenging program with mountain hikes, fishing trips with some trips lasting up to four days. The camp motto is "Work well done is the best of fun". The camp was limited to 18 Scouts at a time for four

two-week sessions. It appears that the camp was not a Council camp as it was run by the Association of Three Pond Camp for Boy Scouts, headquartered in Waltham, MA

Rick Stewart, the Museum columnist in the ISCA Journal, sent some clarifying information about something I wrote in the June, 2023 issue. I mentioned CAMP LAKOTA (Black Swamp Council) near Woodstock, IL as having been sold. This camp is actually located near Defiance, OH and is still active. The CAMP LAKOTA near Woodstock, IL was owned by the former Northwest Suburban Council which became part of the Pathway to Adventure Council has been sold. Thank you, Rick, for setting the record straight.




Rick noted that his local Council (Three Fires) had to sell CAMP FREELAND LESLIE near Oxford, WI. It was opened in 1972 and was closed after the 2021 season.

Rick believes that it was sold to a local businessman who is turning it into an RV park which is better than condos or an open hearth blast furnace.

Dick Cordes (remember him?) found that two YMCA

Camps are offering BSA merit badges to their Scout campers. YMCA CAMP SEA GULL and YMCA CAMP SEAFARER are both located in Arapahoe, NC (I never knew there was a town by that historic name). They have registered Merit Badge Counselors for 12 Merit Badges and campers can expect to earn 1-2 MB's during a two-week session. Does anyone know of any other non-BSA



camps offering Merit Badges or other BSA advancement?

I would like to close with a mention of an article that was in our local newspaper (The 7/27/2023 issue of the CT Post. The headline was "Private Island for rent was once home to a Boy Scout Camp."

Naturally, that caught my attention. The article said that "in the middle of Lake Pocotopaug an old Boy Scout Camp sits on an island." It did not mention the camp by name but it was CAMP TERRAMUGGUS owned by Central Connecticut Council. The name of the island is Laurel Island although it was known colloquially as Boy Scout Island. It may now be rented for \$5500/weekend or \$10,000/week. Individual cabins may also be rented.

## World Jamboree Connections

# 25<sup>th</sup> World Jamboree: A Trip Back 32 Years

Who says you cannot visit a World Jamboree again? I was not planning on going to South Korea. Nevertheless, very late May I saw on the official 25<sup>th</sup> WJ Facebook site about special 1991 Reunions, the first cutoff date was May 26. Since I was at the 1991 World Jamboree at Soraksan, South

Korea, I made inquiries. After several communications, my wife and I were on the tour. We purchased our non-stop airfare 10 days before departure. We arrived a day early to help with the time change.

The 1991 Reunion Tour began on July 30<sup>th</sup> three days before the 25<sup>th</sup> Jamboree opening. There were only 28 people on the Reunion Tour; most were from Hong Kong and Taiwan. There was one Australian that attended the 1991 WJ as a USA contingent youth member since he was a member of a BSA Troop in Japan at the time. It was a great tour before the start of the Jamboree. We stayed at and visited the 1991 Jamboree site. The Korean Scout Association has oversight of the site and built several buildings including guest accommodations for Scout training. The 1991 17<sup>th</sup> World Jamboree site located in the Northeast corner of South Korea had the same picturesque setting that I remembered with dramatic mountains and ocean views. The area had more hotels and businesses because it was also the site of the 2018 Winter Olympics. We also toured several local tourist sites in the area before heading to the 25<sup>th</sup> World Jamboree site.



The 25<sup>th</sup> World Jamboree site on the west coast of South Korea was a reclaimed tidal flood plain. The hills to the east were low and lush and the large flat site was barren of any natural shade. During the previous week, prior to the arrival of participants, the site experienced above normal rain and increasing heat. Many of the subcamps did not drain properly and had standing water that led some countries to delay their arrival a day, including the USA contingent. When contingents arrived, many had to change their original sub-camp location to a different subcamp. The Koreans provided plastic pallets to set the tents on to help with drainage issues. The heat and lack of shade added to the many challenges the participants

encountered.

On August 2, even though Daily Visitors were not allowed yet, the Reunion Tour were special guests and attended the opening ceremony. Prior to arriving at the 25<sup>th</sup> World Jamboree site, the 1991 Reunion Tour were given a Reunion badge (note that the Reunion badge had only 8<sup>th</sup> Aug) and a white polo shirt with the Reunion logo on the front and a large 1991 logo on the back to wear at the opening ceremony. Upon arrival at the Welcome Center, the Reunion Tour members received a VIP ID with a special lanyard, "opening ceremonies" wristband and lastly we were given a special commemorative

leather belt and buckle. The belt and buckle were masterfully crafted, the buckle in Korea and the leather in Tuscany in Italy. The "Hand logo" on the tag certified that the leather was vegetable-tanned hide from Tuscany, adhering to a century of tradition. The Hong Kong tour members produced a Hong Kong Reunion contingent badge as one of their six-dragon badge set.




The largest 1991 Reunion event was scheduled for August 8<sup>th</sup> with a gathering taking place in the "Delta Area" at the 1991 Reunion Café. The location was slightly behind the country tents and near the entrance. In the special Reunion area were many tables with umbrellas, a two-story structure, for a "Tea Party" reception, as well a shaded Trading Area with tables and chairs and the large memorabilia display. The Scout Collector Clubs of Korea & Singapore took leadership of creating the 1991 memorabilia display. The display was in a long tent with eight rows

of at least 6 to 8 3½'x7' panels. Memorabilia included badges, paper items, and stamps. Additional items provided by the Korean Scout Association from the 2023 World Jamboree bid were also included. The display was to be finalized in time for the Reunion on August 8. The Scout Collector Clubs of Korea & Singapore display teams also produced several commemorative badges.

On August 7<sup>th</sup> a day before the 1991 Reunion an announcement was broadcast canceling the event due to the planned evacuation of the remaining participants on the 8<sup>th</sup>. For myself and the other 200 registered attendees this was a great disappointment. I was looking forward to seeing the completed 1991 memorabilia displays and swapping with the other attendees.

I am planning to give a report on the basic 25th World Jamboree official items as well as the various National Scout Organizations contingent items in the next ISCA Journal issue March 2024.

# Unreported Creek Nation KRH

Every so often, eBay uncovers amazing memorabilia. At the end of September, I witnessed discovery of an unreported khaki and red half strip (KRH) from "CREEK NATION", which was a council chartered in Okmulgee, OK. Creek Nation merged with Tulsa County Council in 1957 to form Indian Nations. This council name is likely foreign to most collectors because they did not issue a CSP. However, it is known by OA

number collectors for chartering Checote Lodge 154 – one of the most difficult OA lodges required to complete a 'number set'. In this case, the lettered shoulder patches (LSPs) are much more valuable than the lodge flap. The KRH brought just shy of \$3000. The same seller also sold the council felt for over \$650. Five years ago, the only example of their red and white full strip (RWF) brought \$5000. This council is long merged with only two shoulder patches and a handful of felts surfacing. The winners of these lots truly found treasure. Photos are provided for your reference.

Early in October, I attended the Ed Harris Trade-O-Ree and had the pleasure of encountering the legendary Alan O'Conner. Going through his trading stock I was blown away by the quantity and quality of his community strips. Buried in his book were 18 wool Sea Scout Winter strips, 5 Sea Scout Summer strips, and 5 Air Scout strips. Finding one example is a welcome surprise... but finding 28 in one location is unheard of! Photos of his dupes, along with other Air/Sea Scout discoveries, are provided for your reference with a summary in Table #1.

Earlier in the year, I was able to pull a "Mc CHORD" red/white military strip from Alan. Mc Chord is an Air Force Base in Western Washington, just south of Tacoma. For 5 years, I drove by Mc Chord on a daily basis and never encountered an example locally... and I feel lucky to have



it in my collection. Other new discoveries include "RUSTON LA." and "NEW ORLEANS LA." city-state tan/red half strips (TRH), "NORUMBEGA" and "VERDUGO HILLS" council blue/white half strips (BWH) on wool, and a "HAWAII" KRH. Scott Peck also discovered an unreported USA/abroad RWH from "KARLSRUHE", located in Germany on the bank of the Rhine

near the French border.



Normally in this column, I deal with large single subjects such as certain neckerchief slide makers or certain types of n/c slides. However, this time is primarily a catch up article on items that came to light since previous articles that dealt with that subject.

In December 2022 ISCA Journal, I dealt with NEAL SLIDES from the 1960 National Jamboree (pages 20-21, and 36). A couple of additional items have surfaced as tied to that Jamboree. York PA had a contingent slide of a hard type of round cardboard. However, I located a neckerchief that is from York to



the '60 N.J. which has a physical fitness theme and a weight lifter lifting barbells. There is a Neal Slide that has the same 3 weights on each side and has "YORK PENNE" on it. The slide also has the large "R" registry mark on the holder as well, which means it was made between 1959 and 1961. (For a Real Slide, Get a Neal Slide page 6-5-14) Richard Shield shared with me that there was a "York Bar Bell Club" which was a manufacturer of barbells and weight lifting equipment in York, PA. The York cardboard type slide is common. The Neal Slide is not. I can't say for sure if the Neal Slide and neckerchief are troop or Council contingent items to the 1960 N.J.



The second Neal Slide identified to a Jamboree is the "HEART OF DIXIE NO. 1 CHOCCOLOCCO". At the time, Choccolocco Council had the number one listing of Councils and was centered out of Anniston. In 1998 it retained the 001 council designation but became Greater Alabama Council out of Birmingham. The only Neal Slides of this design that Greg Rosalia and I were aware of when we did

our Neal Slide book all have the large "R" registry mark on them which date them 1959-61. (For a Real Slide Get a Neal Slide page 6-5-5) Bruce Shelley has communicated with someone from there that says that this slide was used at the '64 N.J. That is possible under one of two different scenarios. Either there could have been enough slides made for the '60 N.J. that they had 120 left for the 3 troops to the '64 N.J. Or, another batch was made with the smaller "R" (dating them '61 and after) that we have yet to record as having been issued. Regardless, this slide does appear to be associated with the '60 N.J.

In March '22 ISCA, I did an article on El-Fab n/c slides (pages 7-9, and 11). Some of these slides in the past year have gone for quite a bit of money. The "CAMP COKER" El-Fab slide from Pee Dee Council in South Carolina went for \$295 on eBay. Even the activity slide "TENNESSEE VALLEY CAMPOREE" from Huntsville,



Alabama went for in the \$200 range. Clearly, there is strong local interest for these slides in the South.

In March '23 ISCA, pages 19-20, I dealt with the Scout Profile n/c slides from the '35 and '37 N.J.s. Since then, I acquired a Tom Sawyer Area Council slide which was out of Hannibal Missouri thanks to John Bibo. It has the "T" and "S" on it. The council was absorbed by Central Missouri Council later in 1937.



After all these years of searching, I've located and acquired a blue plastic Turk's head n/c slide with the #6 on it. The numbers appear twice on the back of each slide and in reverse. The numbers were placed on the

molds correctly, and so they are mirrored on the slides. I was pretty sure it existed, because an even number would have made a symmetrical mold (1-6). It was probably in a 3x2 arrangement. Mitch Reis and I believe the individual slides were numbered on the master mold so that any problem with the slides could easily be identified as to which individual mold it was. The plastic ones were made during World War II due to metal requirements for the war ('43-'44) and had minimal use because of the ample supply of metal ones before hand and with the low demand during the war. (ISCA Journal Sept. 2007, pages 8-10) As a result, they are very rare!

I usually don't venture into Order of the Arrow n/c slides. Dave Minnihan and Bruce Shelley do such a great job in all areas of OA including n/c slides that I can't compete with their expertise and contacts. I will make an exception here on a couple of items. Area XI-B used only n/c slides for their conclaves from



1959-1967. "Sandy's" made the slides for the '64 and '65 years. (ISCA March 2014, pages 8-10) I've discovered a second variety of the 1965 issue. It is rectangular shape instead of the normal Washington shape. It uses the same red colored arrow as the '64. The normal '65 has a gold colored arrow. It also has the same neckerchief holder on the back as the '64. The normal '65 has a two piece neckerchief holder. Therefore, it looks like a transitional piece or a prototype for the normal '65. This is not unusual for Sandy's slides, as I have seen and acquired varieties for the same event. However, here we seem to have a one only known.



Maka-Ina Lodge 350 had a ceremonial dance team which began in 1964. Later they used fluorescent materials to add to their presentation and became known as the "Blacklight Dance Team" in 1966. They performed at the Chief Logan Reservation's Friday night campfires, the Area 4F Conference in 1964, the Scout Leaders Conference for Region 4, among other things. And, they

were competing for a spot at the 1967 National Order of the Arrow Conference. The dance team involved fewer than 20 boys. The only insignia of this dance team was a nickel-silver plated n/c slide made by Sherman Landman who had input with the team; slides were given to the members in either 1964 or 1965. It is the shape of a Fleur-de-lies with an Indian in a headdress and a star

on each side. This particular slide was given to Steve Wright, a member of the dance team. It is now in my collection, and is one of only two (the other unplated) that I have seen in 59 years of collecting Sherman Landman memorabilia. You can find more details about this slide in the Sherman Landman and His Legacy book on the Scout Patch Collectors FB page under files on pages 311-313.

Finally, a report and a preview: deceased collector Ed Harris was friends with famous story teller and n/c slide and bolo tie carver Bill Burch. If you don't know who Bill Burch was, he can be found easily on line with such searches as: "Bill Burch wood carver",



"Only a block of wood", "Bill Burch bolo tie", etc. Bill carved, gave away, and sold nearly 50,000 slides and bolo ties in his lifetime! Although they are not rare, they are treasured by those who received them, usually as gifts from Bill himself. Ed Harris received many of Bill's slides and bolas, his display boards, and 12 board carving instruction plan. There are very early examples of his work and rare designs as well. 10 of Burch's more recent bolo tie designs were auctioned off at the Ed Harris TOR in Keizer OR (near Salem) on 10/7/2023. They went for between \$60-\$80. At future annual TORs, many of the above described prized creations will be offered for auction. Collectors of Bill Burch take note and "be prepared".

# Long Sought California First Issue Badge Surfaces

John Shaw of California recently acquired possibly the rarest OA insignia badge from his state, a light blue felt arrowhead badge, tentatively identified as the Swegedaigea Lodge 263 A0.5. This badge was not listed in the Blue Book and earlier insignia guides but was thought to have existed at one time because it had been seen in old photos. It is shown now on OAInsignia.com as pending.

The newly chartered Erie Canal Lodge 159 of Western New York Scout Council in western New York has issued, or was about to issue, its first flap as we finished this column in October. Marty Abramson tells us that the first order was perhaps 200 flaps and that they are to be distributed (mailed?) to members of the two merging lodges that paid their dues for 2023. There is some concern that those two lodges together had many more members at the start of 2023 than the number of flaps that may have been ordered. There is a rumor that more flaps are coming. The first flap was shown at the council's trade-o-ree in October but was not available. It includes in its design the notation "Est. 2023" and it is not clear if the second order, if there is one coming, includes that.



Jimmy Ball of Ofi' Tohbi Lodge 748 reports several new issues from his lodge including a National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) flap, a new back patch for which segments will be available, and a flap-like decal. He also sent black & white photocopies

of these plus three flaps associated with the 2023 E3 Conclave and a shoulder tab mentioned last issue. The NYLT flap mentions both predecessor lodge names (and the Camp Yocona logo), but not the new lodge name. The theme of the conclave was Viking related and each lodge attending created a flap mentioning a character from Norse mythology.

A second letter from Jimmy included a photocopy of their 2023 National Jamboree flap that fits to the base of the Natchez Trace Council Jamboree set (pentagon center and four JSPs). The jamboree flap came with the set or brothers could buy two separately from the set. The lodge has also issued a second back patch via pre-order for \$50 with gold border (50 made?).

David Fry sent us images over the past several months of new issues from Kittatinny Lodge 5. The first in July were two two-piece sets for the 2023 National Jamboree. The multi-color set cost \$15 (400 made) and the white ghost set was \$25 (200 made). There was also a flap given to people who participate in camp promotions and elections teams. Next was a flap issued as part of set of CSP shapes for NYLT (\$10 each, limit two per person). And just recently he sent us a flap issued in October to mark Maggie Thorpe as the 2023 E-11 Section Chief. The lodge made 550 of this chief flap that are sold for \$5, with 50 given to the Chief for her to use as gifts.

Roger Ward of Florida called us recently with several stories that have come his way through his work, including the appearance of the Erie Canal Lodge first flap. One story that is a little embarrassing for us is that Maui Council and Maluhia Lodge 554 were apparently absorbed by Aloha Council and Na Mokupuni O Lawelawe Lodge 567 in 2019 and we missed it.

Another lead from Roger had us reach out to David Panko of Gila Lodge 378. David tells us that Yucca

Council of El Paso, Texas, and Great Southwest Area Council of Albuquerque, New Mexico, are in merger talks. Both boards have voted to merge, and the vote is being taken to the councils. David is on the merger committee and in his opinion the combination is inevitable. In that case, the recommendation is to create a new council and a new OA lodge. The name and totem of the new lodge will be decided by the youth in the two lodges and will be chartered January 1, 2025.

Roger also mentioned the possibility of a merger in Arkansas between Quapaw Area Council (Quapaw Lodge 160) of Little Rock and Westark Area Council (Wachtschu Mawachpo Lodge 559) of Fort Smith. We contacted Bryan West, and he confirmed that this merger is happening and both a new council and lodge would result. Quapaw Area had already absorbed Ouachita Area Council (Wazhazee Lodge 366) of Hot Springs in 2011 and Eastern Arkansas Area Council (Hi'Lo Ha Chy'a-la Lodge 413) of Jonesboro in 2002. This merger will leave De Soto Area (Abooikpaaqun Lodge 399) of El Dorado as the only other council in the state. Brent Williamson serves on the DeSoto Area Council board, and he says that there are no talks of merger currently.

Rodney Hovermale confirmed that Mason-Dixon Council (Hagerstown, Maryland) has become a district within Shenandoah Area Council (Winchester, Virginia) as of August 1. He believed that the executive committees of Guneukitschik Lodge 317 and Shenshawpotoo Lodge 276 would be meeting in the fall to decide how the two OA lodges would go forward.

A 20-patch group from Northeast Georgia Council issued for the 2023 National Jamboree sold on eBay early August for \$540, plus shipping, after 30 bids. The set featured art from the Waffle House, included one two-piece OA set, and two back patches, each surrounded by five JSPs. The last three bidders, at \$215 or more, had low or very low eBay ratings, including one person with a zero rating.

Amangi Nacha Lodge 47 has issued a pair of two-piece sets as fundraisers to sponsor youth for the 2024 NOAC. There are 100 of the sets with blue mylar borders and 200 sets with black borders. The price is \$50 per set, plus \$5 shipping. The flap design shows a beach, and the chevron shows an underwater scene with a variety of sea life. The chevrons in both sets do not identify the issuing lodge.

Paul Myers shared this display of Indiana council and lodge insignia superimposed on a state map at the Sakima TOR in August and he has also shared it online. He tries to collect the first flap or first badge from these lodges, together with the earliest council shoulder insignia, and a local camp badge that also identifies the council, but all of that insignia would not fit in the frame.



A Buckongehannon Lodge 527 S1 first flap sold on eBay in early September for \$318, plus shipping. What makes this sale noteworthy is that the flap apparently suffered a thread break during its loom run and no lodge number was present. Six people bid 12 times. This flap was originally listed in August and sold then for \$362 but the winner, who had bid on it 19 times, failed to pay for it. The mint example of this flap in the Dave Thomas collection was priced at \$585, but we know that a mint example sold on eBay in 2018 for \$408.

A rarely seen 1958 gold Lodge Secretary medal, made by the Caldwell Jewelers, sold on eBay in September for \$250 after one bid. The medal shows a Native American paddling a canoe. On the reverse it was engraved "Lodge 55 Secretary 1958."


In early October a post to the Scout Patch Collectors Facebook group sought information on a wolf head totem pin. The first comments suggested it was from

Minsi Lodge 5. Bill Topkis is the most advanced and most knowledgeable collector of totem pins, and he explained it was used exclusively by Ty-Ohni Lodge 95 of Rochester, New York. Bill shared these photos of the pin from his collection and a ring of the same design. The Vigil pin and ring both belonged to two-time Ty-Ohni Lodge Chief Malcom Stevenson. Both the pin and ring have a Vigil triangle on the head of the wolf. Bill also owns a Chief medal that belonged to Mr. Stevenson, engraved on the back "H. M. Stevenson 39-40-45." He noted that in many lodges there is one longtime member who is considered a legend and Mr. Stevenson is that Brother for Ty-Ohni Lodge 95.



Michael Jacobson tells us that Toontuk Lodge 549 has only 26 members currently but hosted the Gateway Region G15 Conclave this year for Alaska and Washington lodges at Lost Lake. For the conclave the lodge issued a five-star shaped backpatch, four flaps that fit against the backpatch, two neckerchiefs (one is an error with the design offset), and a wood neckerchief slide. He also reports that the lodge made twenty each of three two-piece sets for the conclave last year held in Washington. The lodge sent three delegates to that conclave, and each had seven of two of the sets and eight of the third. The patches were made in Fairbanks and were not all completed in time. The rest were finished after the delegates got back.

A T'Kope Kwiskwis Lodge 502 F1 was offered on eBay in October together with a 1955 membership card and an Ordeal Ceremony manual. A note added in ink on the manual read "Sahaptin Chapter." The starting price for the lot was \$9.95 and the flap looked mint, but it was scheduled to end after the



submission date for our column. A detail that caught some attention was that the name of the lodge on the membership card was Silver Marmot. The seller told us he had about 10 more membership cards from this person with the name shown as on the flap.

A small felt fellowship badge in an eBay lot caught Frank Kern's eye and he may have discovered an event patch from a lodge name for which nothing was known previously to exist. The lot also contained



Snake River Council Summer Camp felts and segments for 1948 and 1949. The mystery felt segment says just "Fellowship" with what looks like a hand or leaf. The Blue Book lists Shoshoni Lodge 363 as being chartered in 1947 but disbanding at some point before rechartering in 1954 as Ma-I-Shu Lodge

363. Frank was struck by the word “fellowship” that we have long associated with the Order of the Arrow. At the Idaho TOR this year, a local collector showed Frank Twin Falls newspaper clippings that mention several fellowships and the Shoshoni Lodge being active in the late 1940s and early 1950s.

We searched newspapers briefly also but never found the word “fellowship” associated with a Shoshoni lodge meeting or event. We did, however, find one article in the Twin Falls Times News from June 11, 1947, which talks about the lodge being first organized and taking the name “Ee-Dah-How,” not Shoshoni. But then sixteen days later a second article reports that the name was changed to Shoshoni. The first name was reserved for a Christian church-sponsored Sea Scout ship. The totem for the new lodge was to be the “sesekoo,” meaning “a snake that rattles.”

There have been many incredible flap designs over the years. Some that come to mind are the classic early flaps like Tamet 225s5, early Semialachee 239s, early Blue Heron 349s, early Echeconnee 358s, early Pachachoag 525s, 1970s issues like Mikanakawa Lodge 101s1, Esselen Lodge 531s1, Talako Lodge 533s5, and Malibu Lodge 566s1. By the way, those 101, 531, 533, and 566 flaps were all designed by Jeff Morely. What is your favorite flap design? Drop us an email and let us know.

Bob Rudd reached out regarding the discussion in our last column presenting the position that the Walah Elamamekhaki Lodge 405r1 badge was not official and that the name never appeared in national documents. Bob told us that a copy of the lodge charter showing that name was published decades ago by Dr. James Flatt in his book about Kentucky and Tennessee OA insignia. We got in touch with Dr. Flatt, and he tells us that he has copies of charters showing both that lodge name and the earlier name, Land of the Big Caves. It appears that regardless of who made that patch and when, the name on it was probably legitimate. Bob is the son of Hal Rudd mentioned in that discussion last time.

- A rarely seen 1958 gold Lodge Secretary medal, made by the Caldwell Jewelers, also sold on eBay in September for \$250 after one bid.

- The art of 2023 National Jamboree set from Timmeu Lodge 74 shows the lodge totem fox on the flap looking into the Mississippi River and two otters cavorting underwater on the chevron.
- The 2023 National Jamboree flap from Bob White Lodge 87 also marks their 87th anniversary from their first charter in 1936.
- Jim Ellis sent us the image of the Sakima Lodge 573 50th anniversary flap with gold mylar “50” that is being given out by the lodge for \$50 donations.
- The design of the 2023 National Jamboree set from Ahoalan-Nachpikin Lodge 558 remembers Natch the Bear who was tied to a tree in 1905 as the first resident of the Memphis Zoo.
- The design of the 2023 National Jamboree flap from Occoneechee Lodge 104 features the Pine Barren Tree Frog, their state frog.
- A Shu-Shu-Gah Lodge 24 Sa-Cut Chapter membership card from 1938 sold on eBay in early October for \$55 after three bids.
- The Owaneco Lodge 313 2023 National Jamboree neckerchief, and perhaps any other Jamboree insignia they issued, notes that Connecticut Yankee Council is home to Pez Candy.
- An original hardcover edition of the OA handbook sold on eBay for \$2025 after 13 bids.
- A Mazama Lodge 421 beaded 1990 NOAC flap, made and signed by well-known bead artist Lloyd “Pinky” Stiewig, sold on eBay for \$610 after six bids after starting at \$110.
- Conclave patch eBay sales that caught our attention lately included these: 1951 12-A (patch says 1950) for \$590 with five bids, 1952 for 11-B \$1,300 with one bid, 1959 12-F for \$551 with two bids, and 1969 12-F for \$817 with two bids.

# Order of the Arrow

My columns of the past couple of years have been about highlighting some overlooked, and some not so overlooked, collecting areas. I have not discussed in some time though our largest collecting area, Order of the Arrow memorabilia, so I am due.

Fortunately the hobby has stalwarts like Dave Minnihan and Bruce Shelley documenting here in ISCA new issues as well as new discoveries and information on old issues. Also there is very active online sharing of OA collecting through ISCA's OAInsignia.com (THE national catalog of all things for lodge issues) as well as other collecting sites like PatchVault.com and in various Facebook collecting groups. A nice feature about OAInsignia.com is the "Recent Changes" tab which is helpful when collecting this area.

Tracy Mesler recently shared to Facebook a picture of trading at the 1938 OA Grand Lodge meeting (the predecessor to National Order of the Arrow Conferences.) Trading and collecting, for those of us that do this, is "in our blood." And has been since our founding.

OA issues, as a whole, is the highest value Scouting collectible in the world. My historical estimate has been that this area of our hobby represents 70% of the value of all Scout memorabilia here in the USA.

Why is this? A couple of reasons come to mind. First, the Order of the Arrow is notably distinctive as non-members determine who are the new members. I have trouble coming up with another

organization that works this way. Nomination for membership might be only one or two persons for a whole troop in any given year. Second, historically the number of patches or items issued was very limited. In part due to there are fewer OA members than there are Scouts. In part, they were not viewed as a collectible per se with many having very tight issue restrictions (1 per honor, 1 per life) and "no trade" restrictions.

It has not, as of yet, set the record for the highest price paid for an individual piece of Scouting memorabilia. That is still the 1947 World Jamboree Maitrisse patch at \$71,000. But the first patch to ever sell for more than \$10,000 was the Huaco lodge 327 X1 that we handled in 1992 that sold for \$12,500 at auction. OA likely has more five figure, i.e., greater than \$10,000, issues than any other area of our hobby. A broad definition of Scout insignia might meet or exceed the number of five figure OA pieces but it is a lot harder to think of the issues than for OA pieces.

So lets look at some different collecting themes within OA, their history and how they are trending.


### National Number Set

This was the THE mountaintop that all major OA collectors pursued through and up to the the 2000's. We believe Hal Rudd of Kentucky was the first to complete a number set, as it was known at the time, in 1965 followed a few months later by E. Forest Reynolds, editor of *The Trader* newsletter.

With the flood of issues in recent decades and the generational turning over of collections there are likely fewer OA national number set collections in the hobby than in the past 50 years. The number used to be quite stable around 16 – 22 collectors with National Number Sets. One of these national collections would break and then someone would complete their collection. Currently there may be fewer than 10. Still a great mountaintop to climb. **Trend:** Cool. Likely to come back

### Name & Number Set

This is the next higher mountain to climb after a national number set. There was always fewer of these than national number sets but typically those pursuing the national number set also pursued this. Bill's book also covered old names or "superceded lodges." Again with the number of lodges forming through council consolidation this area has a small following but I am also getting the sense of folks pursuing this BECAUSE there are so many new names to go after which can be tracked down and in most

cases easy to acquire. Once started, one wants to complete the trek. **Trend:** Warming up.

## OBV sets

I am not sure when the first Ordeal-Brotherhood-Vigil set of flaps came out. 406 Chickasah had and OBV set for their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary issued in 1974. 462 Ku-ni-eh had a set before their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary flap in 1976 but I do not know the year of issuance. 162 Migisi Opawgan's first OBV set was likely also early 1970s. There could have been something before these examples.


This was a popular collecting theme from the 1980s through the 2000s but I hear less talk about it these days. In part, National OA came down against lodges making these sets as we are all equal members with our sashes being our point of distinction. Also, so many lodges issued these sets and different series of these sets that it started to overwhelm collectors. It is still a theme that is pursued but not as aggressively today as during those earlier years. A collecting list might help. There is a sub-theme related to this and that is Vigil flaps only. **Trend:** Cool

## First Flaps

Collectors Jeff Morley and Bill Topkis really kicked this off with the publication of their book *First Flaps* in 1992. Although preceded by Guy Hatfield (who really built his off of acquiring Lou Carter's set), Jeff and Bill put the research in to the issues

for all of the lodges at the time. Their work was later extended by Dave Thomas's *First Flaps in Color* reference book that is still coveted. I have often referred to these as being the "rookie cards" of our hobby. With lodges making so many issues folks have trended towards getting the first. As an aside, we are thinking the "first of the first flaps" is the 33 Ajapeu F1. **Trend:** Warm to Hot

## First Solid Flaps

We are seeing this as a related collecting theme either in place of First Flaps or as an adjunct to collecting First Flaps as the search gets harder. Obviously there are many cases where the First Flap and the First Solid Flap are the same issue. The first "first solid flap" we believe to be from Delmont 43. **Trend:** Heating up

## OA All Issues

There was a time when collectors pursued all issues for all lodges. Very few are doing this these days. OAInsignia.com is

listing over 68,000 issues currently and it is expanding every day. Some collectors pursue this with a cut-off on time period, e.g., 1990 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary or 2015 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The most complete OA collection on display is at the World Scouting Museum in Charleston, WV. **Trend:** Cool.



Compare the number of "known" issues at this time to today's lodge listings. This example shows one of the extremes at that time, Karankawa Lodge 307 with 21 total issues since its founding in 1945. Today it has 219 issues.


And that is certainly not the most extreme example.

In 1979 Albertus Hoogeveen published, working with Dave Leubitz's collection, a more formal catalog of all OA issues known at the time along with more complete documentation concerning border type and color, background color, letter color and description. Our hobby had never had anything like this until this time. It was standard for serious collectors, even if not collecting all issues, to have a binder with this reference work with them to look up issues. The first edition, Arapaho II, just had the catalog. A few years later they published a supplement with black and white pictures for all lodges.

## First Issues



First issue for Sanhican Lodge 2 out of Trenton, NJ. It pre-dates the "Wab issue" for this lodge.

It seems during my collecting years that once flaps came out, odd shapes took a back seat in collectors' interest. But now with the mass production of issues, there seems to be revived interest in the first issues. If First Flaps are the "rookie cards" of the hobby, then "first issues" are the "rookie cards of the rookie cards." Some are exceedingly common even 70 years after issuance and others can make first flaps look easy. **Trend:** Warm to Sizzling Hot.

This is the first issue for Wyona Lodge 18 from Bloomsburg, PA. It is pictured in the 1950 OA Handbook. Like many first issues, there is very little identifying what lodge it is from or that it is even a Scout patch. It existed at the time of the Wab book but given how Dwight gathered information about issues, he had no reply from the council and so it is not listed.



## Wab Issues

Dwight Bischel in 1952 published the first OA illustrated collecting book. He named it after his lodge at the time, the *Wabaningo Lodge Emblem Handbook*. It really was a seminal work. Actually, the OA Handbooks from 1948 through this time had pages picturing OA patches but they were not collecting lists. In some cases it was even wrong as it pictured patches that were not OA issues.


Dwight's work was a collecting theme at the time and continues to this day. Actually, Joe Taylor of Texas has done a major, full color update of Dwight's original work just released this year. This area overlaps with several of the previously mentioned themes including First Flaps, First Issues, and First Solid Flaps. Getting the particularly correct variety can be very challenging. **Trend:** Hot and Heating up

## Ghost flaps

In 1994 a white buffalo was born in Janesville, WI. The last time one was reported being seen was in 1933. Mike Welsh, owner of Welsh Industries in DeKalb, IL (just due south of Janesville) used it as a marketing pitch to some lodges to issue a commemorative flap in all white. It was a good marketing plan as several other lodges took up the idea although with different designs and different colors. These came to be called "ghost flaps" as the writing is the same color and thus "ghosted in." From a dealer's perspective, these are a pain to read and thus sometimes are a challenge to identify. It has been a collecting theme but I am seeing less of it as a theme although the issues are still desired by lodge collectors. **Trend:** Cooling off

## Two-piece sets

Mike was also, to the best of my knowledge, the one who came up with the idea of a "two piece set." I do not know for which lodge as of this writing. Patch companies sell by the square inch so having larger patches is a good thing for them. They remain quite popular as new issues and trading items for NOACs, Conclaves, and National Jamborees. From a fundraising perspective they have been very good for Scouting. For collectors though, I am not so sure. Mike has been quoted as saying "Of all the ideas I've come up with, the one I regret the most is two piece sets." So take it from there. **Trend:** Fun for a while but cooling off

## Anniversary Sets

There are several categories within this theme. Examples are lodge 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary issues, lodge 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary issues, OA 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary (i.e., 1965) issues, OA 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary (i.e., 1990), OA 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary (i.e., 2015). These collecting themes wax and wain but still seem to have broad interest in part because the patches are dated. As a result, collectors readily know the age of the issue. **Trend:** Warm

## Lodge All Issue Set

I am attributing the decline in national number sets due to lodges issuing so many issues. I remember a conversation with collector Dave Leubitz years ago recounting how when starting collecting he thought when he got to ten (10) different lodge flaps that would be something. Then his goal became to get to 100 different. He eventually ended up with over 10,000 issues. Well, for some lodges these days one could get to ten issues in one event, let alone one year! When Dave started collecting, lodges did not have that many total issues even if they had been around for decades.

A later conversation with collector and former National Commissioner Tico Perez where I asked "Why the decline in interest in Florida issues?" To which he replied, "We now have lodges with more issues than their lodge number! One can spend their collecting career just going after their home lodge and then the state." So true. And this was a conversation some years ago.

What IS happening though in this area is that collectors are now pursuing ALL issues from their lodge. This includes not just flaps and odd shapes but activity patches, neckerchiefs, and jacket patches. It also includes other non-cataloged items such as belt buckles, pins, shirts, hats, and other lodge emblazoned ephemera. Collectors are even pursuing lodge newsletters and award certificates. These were overlooked areas decades ago making for some surprising upsides when such items do surface. **Trend:** Warm with selective hot for certain lodges.

## Section/State All Issue Set

This is the next extension from the home lodge, all issue theme. Once one has collected their lodge, or are topping out in that theme, this is a common extension. **Trend:** Cool to Hot depending upon the geography.

## Chenilles

These are "letter sweater" patches (do they even have these any more?). They are hand made one at a time in general rather than mass produced on big looms. This collecting theme has some of the rarest, and thus highest value, patches in our hobby. THE collector in this area, Joe Maloy of New Jersey, passed away a couple of years ago but he was not alone. He was the most aggressive at collecting all chenille issues old and new though. Today most collectors go after their lodge or state or as part of another theme (e.g., Wab issues). (An aside, Joe by the way had one of the most interesting lodge misspelled issues collections.)

**Trend:** Sleeper, could heat up.



This is the Chimalus lodge 242's first chenille. It is considered the "Wab issue" although the Wab book pictures a felt on felt patch which we believe is a proto-type with only one known. It is roughly four inches and is magnitudes harder, and thus more valuable, than the later issues which are roughly have this size. Standard Penant Co. of Big Run, PA made this and many of the earliest, and most valuable, chenilles.

## Fake Issues

There has been some recent discussion around this theme. There were collector made fakes back in the 1960s. There was a former

Scout professional that reproduced a dozen or so of some of the toughest issues in the early 1970s. With computer stitching, Asian sourced, and for some reason Canadian sourced, fakes regularly appear on eBay. There are not many who might collect all fakes but many add these into their lodge collections. **Trend:** Warm

When I first sat down to write this column I was thinking I would only have a few themes to cover. As I wrote though and recollected what I have seen over the years the list of themes to mention that occurred to me kept expanding. Through all of the years, collectors have created and pursued themes that

Alleged to have been made by an eastern Pennsylvania collector, various obscure lodges that collectors had on their need list started to appear in the late 1960s. Most were found to have been "used" thus providing some "provenance" that they were real. As senior collectors started to share with friends recent acquisitions, they started to discover that they had each acquired the same patch from the same source. Oh oh.

are of interest to them whether "hot" or "cold." So here is one more theme.

## Last Issue Set

This is not a trend but is a personal favorite of mine as I work on this collection after having done several of the above. One still needs a Baluga 538 as it was their "last issue" even as it was

their only issue. Same for Calusa 219, Saukenuk 504, Monsey 543, etc.. But tracking down the last flap, many now called "death flaps," has been a fun quest. I joke at times how I am trading old issues for new issues. With lodges merging and reforming, the research of what was last issued is a fun part of the challenge. In several cases, the last issue although less sought after, is harder than the first issue. **Trend:** Who knows? Who cares? But it's fun, at least for me. And isn't that what collecting is all about?

Now tell me what I have missed. There are many more than I have mentioned. ;-)
